The doubles is the first event of the tournament weekend and many competitors use it as a warm up to Friday's qualifying. In the Brewhouse Doubles, 2 players alternate frames, building a game while competing in match play. There is a strategy involved in determining which partner will play the odd frames and which will bowl the even frames

Twenty four (24) doubles teams are drawn into three pools for a single round robin match play. The top two teams in each pool (6 in all) advance to the round robin finals. This unique format is interesting and fun to play but the \$3200.00 prize list for this event ensures that bowlers take the competition seriously.

This is the **MAIN EVENT** of the tournament. Through the gruelling set of qualifying rounds this elite field will be culled to 32 survivors. These 32 competitors spend Sunday in intense match play competition, where throwing 900 three game series is no guarantee of winning a match. The Brewhouse Jubilee Ford Open Champion will have demonstrated endurance, skill under pressure and mental resiliency in attaining the \$5000.00 first prize.

Format: Competitors bowl eight games in order to qualify. The top 32 bowlers from the combined qualifying rounds advance to Sunday's match play. Bowlers on the "A" side are seeded according to their qualifying position while "B" side matches are determined by a random draw.

Each match consists of three games, with the bowler scoring the highest 3 game total (pinfall) advancing. All bowlers begin the day alive on both sides. A bowler is eliminated from the tournament when that bowler loses on both the "A" side and the "B" side. The winner of the Brewhouse Jubilee Ford Open is determined by the "A" side Champion playing the "B" side Champion in a 3 game total pinfall series.

A bowler can win both the "A" side and the "B" side, thus taking home both first and second place money. Bruce Morter (Edmonton) accomplished this feat in 1999 as did Reg Wingham (Melfort) in 1976.
